No.GG/Guj/78/2014/MHK/102014/1728/C:- In exercise of the powers conferred by clause (b) of section 5 of the Gujarat Police Act, 1951 ( Bom. XXII of 1951), the Government of Gujarat hereby makes the following rules further to amend the Gujarat Police Sub- Inspector (Unarmed Branch) Special Competitive Examination Rules ,2004 namely:-

- 1. These rules may be called the Gujarat Police Sub- Inspector (Unarmed Branch) Special Competitive Examination (Amendment) Rules, 2014.
- 2. In the Gujarat Police Sub- Inspector (Unarmed Branch) Special Competitive Examination Rules, 2004 (hereinafter referred to as "the said rules"), in rule 5, for the words, "in written test, physical test and interview test", the words, "in physical test and written test" shall be substituted.
- In the said rules, in rule 6, in sub-rules (1) and (2), for the word and letters, "paper III," the words and letters, "Paper - II of Appendix B" shall be substituted.
- In the said rules, for rule 7, the following rule shall be substituted, namely:-

### "7. (a) Physical test

(1) The physical test shall be of qualifying nature. No marks shall be given for the physical test.



(2) The physical test shall consisting of 800 meters running for male and female candidate and within the following time duration shown against the concerned age group.

#### (A) For Male Candidates:-

NO.	Age Group	Maximum Time duration

2.	36 to 40 Years	5 Minutes and 25 Seconds.

5.	51 and above	6 Minutes and 45 Seconds.	

#### (B) For Female candidates:-

NO	Age Group	Maximum Time duration

3.	36 to 40 Years	7 Minutes.
4.	36 to 40 Years	7 Minutes and 10 Seconds.
5.	51 years and above	7 Minutes and 30 Seconds.

- (3) A Candidate shall have to produce certificate relating medically fitness of a Registerd Medical Practitioner for appearing in the physical test.
- (4) A Candidate, who has completed the physical test successfully shall be called for the written test.

#### (b) Written Test:-

- (1) The written test shall consist of two parts, as follwing:

  Part I:-Objective Type Written Test

  Part II:- Subjective Type Written Test
- (2) The Board shall call the eligible candidate, who have successfully completed the physical test, for objective type written test.
- (3) Such candidate, who have obtained minimum qualifying marks in the objective type written test, as may be determined by the Board, shall be called for subjective type written test to be held by the Board.
- (4) The number of candidates called for subjective type written test shall ordinarily be five times the number of vacancies requisitioned.

)

- (5) The Board shall declare the list of successful candidates in objective type written test.
- (6) A candidate, who desires to have his marks of objective type written test rechecked, may apply to the Board along with such fees, as may be fixed by the Board, within a period of fifteen days from the date of declaration of the result of the objective type written test.
- (7) The syllabus of the objective type written test shall be as specified in Appendix A.
- (8) The syllabus of the subjective type written test shall be as specified in Appendix B".

- 5. In the said rules, for rule 8, the following rule shall be substituted, namely:-
  - "8 (1) The qualifying standard for objective type written test and subjective type written test shall be determined by the Board from time to time. If necessary, the Board may determine qualifying standard separately for Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes and Non-reserved categories of candidates. However, the minimum qualifying standard that may be determined by the Board shall not in any case be less than 40% of marks in each test. i.e objective type written test and subjective type written test. The candidate who is found qualified in the objective type written test according to the qualifying standard determined by the Board shall only be called for subjective type written test.
    - (2) The candidate who is qualified in the objective type written test and called for subjective type written test but fails to attend the subjective type written test on the specified date and time shall not be eligible for selection."
- 6. In the said rules, for rule 9, the following rule shall be substituted, namely:-

- "9 The Board shall declare the result of the examination in two parts as under, namely:-
  - Part I: The Board shall cause to prepare the result of the successful candidates in the order of merit on the basis of aggregate marks finally awarded to each candidate in the objective type written test and subjective type written test to the extent of the number of vacancies requisitioned and the same shall be caused to be published on the notice board and/or on the official web-site of the Board and the copy of the result so published shall be sent to the Government in Home Department and Director General and Inspector General of Police's office at Gandhinagar to display the same on the notice Board.
  - Part II: The Board shall cause to prepare a list of the unsuccessful candidates who are not included in the result prepared in Part I, specifying their names, seat

numbers and total marks obtained by them in the objective type written test and subjective type

shall be caused to be written test and the same published on the notice board and/ or on official web- site of the board and the copy of the result so published shall be sent to the Government in Home Department and Director General and Inspector General of Police's office at Gandhinagar to display the same on the notice Board.

In the said rules, for the existing Appendix, the following Appendixes 7. shall be substituted, namely:

The objective type written examination shall be of 200 marks consisting of 2 written papers, as below:-

# Note:

- The objective type written test shall consist of Multiple Choice 1. Question (MCQ) and O.M.R. (Optical Mark Reader) system.
- Every question shall be of one mark. 2.
- The candidate shall have to attempt all questions. 3.
- Every attempted question with incorrect answer shall carry a negative 4. marks of 0.25.
- In every question, there shall be one option of "Not attempted." If the candidate does not know the answer, He may select this option. If the 5. candidate selects this option, no negative marks shall be given.
- If the candidate has not selected any of the options given for answer to 6. the question, then, it shall carry a negative marks of 0.25.
